New 3T MRI Technology— Greater Detail and Resolution

Sibley's newly renovated magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) suite now includes 1.5T and 3T MRI machines, in addition to our 1.5T MRI scanner in the Medical Building. Each MRI scanner produces excellent diagnostic-quality images. Our new 3T MRI provides even greater detail and resolution necessary for certain exams that require increased visualization of subtle abnormalities.

The 3T MRI maximizes patient comfort with a spacious 70-centimeter-wide design that requires less repositioning between exams and allows many exams to be performed feet-first.

Sibley's MRI technologists are registered by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (AART). They use the appropriate machine based on the physician's order and the technology that best suits the patient's needs and safety concerns (patients with certain medically implanted devices cannot be imaged at 3T).

Studies that can benefit from our new 3T MRI include:

- · Musculoskeletal (specifically wrist and hip arthrograms)
- Neurological (brain and spine)
- · Abdominal, chest and pelvis (gynecologic and prostate)
- MRA (Magnetic Resonance Angiogram)

Appointments are available seven days a week for MRI, CT and diagnostic imaging. Please call 202-537-4795.
